Abstract art - only a small part of it plus calligraphy, jewelry (part of) and architecture

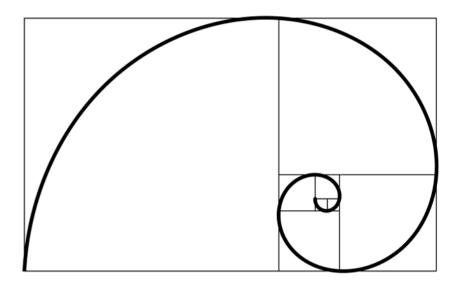
Pure mathematics - in its purest form should bring joy and not be used as a tool to help
